Hawai'i Passenger Arrivals By Air

HONOLULU – The number of passengers flying into Hawai'i continues to drop. Yesterday, 1,207 people arrived in Hawai'i on the third day of the state's 14-day mandatory self-quarantine for all incoming passengers. Of that number, 151 people were visitors, and most of the passengers were either returning residents or crew members. In comparison, during this same time last year, more than 30,000 passengers arrived in Hawai'i daily, including residents and visitors. This table shows the number of people who arrived by air on March 28th.
